Zell's got a big personality; he is often contrarian, blunt, and irreverent, and always curious and hardworking. This is the guy who was wearing jeans to work in the 1960s, when offices were a sea of gray suits. He's the guy who told *The Wall Street Journal* in 1985, "If it ain't fun, we don't do it."
